27 students from Need Base India appeared in the SSLC exams, 14 students scored 1st class and 13 students scored 2nd class and passed the exams

Need Base India is delighted to share the exceptional grades achieved by our SSLC 27 students. These students, hailing from vulnerable backgrounds and having never previously attended school, have shown remarkable dedication and perseverance. Their success in completing the SSLC exams is a testament to their hard work and the support of our NBI educators. We are immensely proud of their achievements and look forward to supporting them in their future endeavors.

Currently, the students have been enrolled in college, with 27 students taking various courses: 11 in Arts, 10 in Commerce (CEBA and HEBA), 2 in Science (PCMC), 2 in Diploma programs, and 2 in Hotel Management.

The camp highlighted Need Base India's commitment to holistic child development.



Governing Board Meeting

Rooting for a Greener Future, One Sapling at a Time

On 15th June 2024, the team at Need Base India conducted a 60 sapling planting program at Chitradurga Devasamudra and Tammanahalli Government Schools. The program was generously supported by Anil Sondur. This initiative aimed to promote environmental awareness and contribute to the beautification and ecological health of the school campuses. The event saw active participation from students, teachers, and community members, who collectively planted a variety of saplings, fostering a sense of responsibility towards nature and community involvement



Infrastructure Development

During the reporting period, we achieved a significant milestone with the construction of a new dormitory center at Bridge Camp Girls Home, generously supported by the Broadridge Team. This development has transformed our ability to provide children with a secure, enriching learning environment and a comfortable living space. On June 3rd, 2024, the dormitory was inaugurated by John Hogan (Senior Managing Director - Broadridge), Tom, Taylor, Sheenam, and other members of the Broadridge team. The event was a resounding success, with the children captivating the audience through vibrant performances, including dance, mime shows, compelling speeches, innovative science experiments, and tech presentations, all dressed elegantly for the occasion. The new dormitory not only represents a physical enhancement but also symbolizes our commitment to fostering the potential of every child under our care.



Menstrual Health and Hygiene Management

We're pleased to introduce our new program on menstrual hygiene management for adolescents and women in rural Chitradurga. The project aims to raise awareness about hygienic sanitation practices, dispel myths and taboos surrounding menstruation, create supportive environments at home and school, promote sustainable menstrual hygiene practices within the community, and ensure safe disposal. The program supports 1200 rural students with better knowledge, attitude, and positive practice toward menstrual health and hygiene are to be maintained as a sustainable approach towards the same. NBI extends its sincere thanks to KENNEMETAL and United Way India for this initiative.



Tailoring Classes

We are proud to announce the successful completion of two batches of tailoring classes for 60 women, who have now become self-employed with the support of Need Base India. This quarter, we identified 30 marginalized rural women from the community, who have been enrolled in our new batch to continue this empowering journey.



"Empowering Rural Karnataka: Launch of New Computer Training Center"

On July 20th, Need Base India launched a computer training center in Koppal. This center provides students and youths with 21st-century digital skills, helping them secure stable, skilled jobs. Many youths in rural areas lack access to computers and digital education. This center bridges the gap by providing essential digital literacy skills, including basic computer operations, internet usage, and software applications. It equips youths with 21st-century digital skills, enhancing their employability for various job opportunities, from administrative roles to specialized positions in IT and digital marketing.



Child Road Safety

This quarter, with the support of United Way Mumbai, we successfully relaunched our Child Road Safety program, focusing on the urgent need for road safety education among urban school students. The program aims to reach 35 schools in Bangalore, creating critical awareness and equipping students with the knowledge to navigate the busy streets safely. In rapidly growing urban areas, where traffic is a constant challenge, educating children on road safety is essential. This initiative not only helps prevent accidents but also empowers students to become responsible pedestrians and future drivers, ensuring a safer environment for everyone.

Every Child to School Campaign:

During the month team conducted the Every Child to School Campaign before the start of the academic year. Need Base India children across 9 residential homes visited the local locality and created awareness of the importance of school enrollment, during the campaign we identified 12 children who dropped out of school due to family issues and migration. The children and parents were counseled on the importance of education and currently, the children were enrolled in the bridge course at the center.



Learning Materials Support at Government Schools

Government school students in Karnataka receive essential support such as textbooks, uniforms, and mid-day meals. However, many lack basic resources like stationery items such as notebooks, pencils, and pens. Most parents of these students are underprivileged. In response to this need, Need Base India distributed notebooks & stationery kits to support these students. In the last quarter, NBI successfully provided educational kits to 1200 students across 12 government schools in Belagavi, Mandya, Bailahongala, and Dharwad Districts.





Community Learning Center

We are pleased to share that during this quarter, our Community Learning Center in Koppal has undergone a significant transformation. We've successfully renovated the facility and established a fully equipped computer lab, designed to empower rural students with essential digital skills. The digital classroom was inaugurated by Veerabasan Gouda (Chartered Accountant, P.K. Subramaniam & Co & Anand M.S. (Secretary, Sineng Electric India Pvt. Ltd) Today, the center supports 80 rural students, providing them with digital education and evening classes, paving the way for a brighter, more connected future.



This quarter, we proudly launched a new Community Learning Center in Srirampura, made possible through the generous support of Azim Premji. The center is already making a significant impact, providing 62 local students with crucial digital skills and evening classes. By bridging the digital divide, we are equipping these young minds with the tools they need to thrive in an increasingly digital world, fostering their growth and future success.
