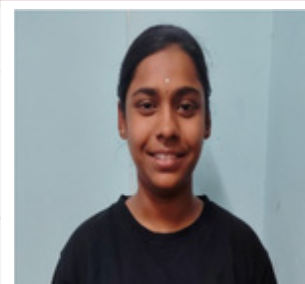

This initiative represents a significant step toward empowering women, strengthening livelihoods, and fostering sustainable community development.

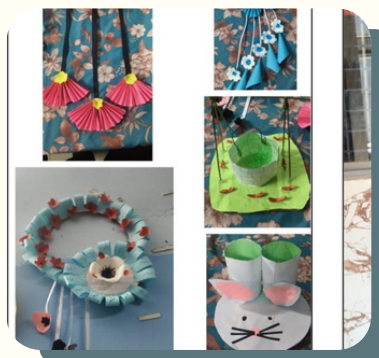


Summer Camp Activities

Need Base India conducted Summer Camps in April 2026 across our Child Care Institutions and Community Care & Learning Centers, offering children opportunities for learning, creativity, recreation, and personal growth. Over 320 children from various homes and centers participated, enjoying a safe and supportive environment throughout the summer vacation.

The camps offered diverse educational and recreational activities, such as foundation classes in English, Kannada, and Mathematics, spoken English, handwriting improvement, science experiments, storytelling, quizzes, life skills, value education, and personality development. Children also took part in arts and crafts, painting, clay modeling, dance, music, drama, yoga, games, treasure hunts, competitions, and environmental awareness. Special sessions on personal hygiene, digital safety, healthy eating, communication, self-awareness, trust-building, and child protection further enhanced their experience.

The summer camps strengthened academic foundations, built confidence, fostered creativity, improved communication and social skills, and developed teamwork and leadership. Interactive learning, cultural activities, and sessions with resource persons and guest speakers supported holistic development and lasting positive outcomes for all participants.





Curiouscity Science Center Educational Visit

On 21 June 2026, children from Bridge Camp Girls Home (BGH) visited the Curiouscity Science Center with Broadridge volunteers. The visit offered opportunities to engage with interactive exhibits, hands-on experiments, illusion zones, science laboratories, and discovery-based activities. The center emphasizes experiential learning, encouraging children to observe, question, and learn through active participation.

Impact:

- Increased children's curiosity and interest in science, technology, and innovation.
- Strengthened critical thinking, observation, and problem-solving skills through hands-on activities.
- Built confidence and engagement by enabling children to explore scientific concepts beyond the classroom.
- Encouraged meaningful interaction between children and Broadridge volunteers, creating a motivating and inspiring learning environment.
- Expanded children's exposure to STEM learning opportunities, encouraging them to pursue broader educational goals.



Solar Water Heater Installation across Five Residential Homes - Supported by Broadridge Financial Solution Pvt Ltd.



With the generous support of Broadridge Financial Solutions Pvt. Ltd., Need Base India successfully installed solar water heating systems in five residential homes, enhancing access to safe, sustainable hot water for children under its care. The initiative benefited a total of 295 children residing in Lakshya Udaan Home (70 children) at Lalbagh, Jayanagar; Shankara Build Pro Boys Home (50 children) at Shantinagara; Shankara Build Pro Girls Home (35 children) at Mahadevpura; and two Bridge Camp Girls Homes located at Immadihalli, Whitefield, and Jalahalli Village, supporting 70 children each. The installation of solar water heaters has significantly improved daily living conditions by ensuring a reliable supply of hot water for bathing and hygiene needs, while also reducing electricity consumption and operational costs. This environmentally sustainable intervention contributes to the health, comfort, and well-being of children, creating a safer, more dignified residential environment.

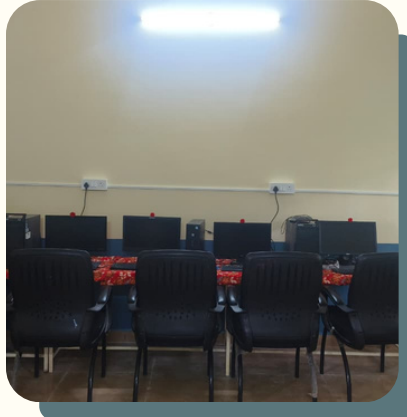

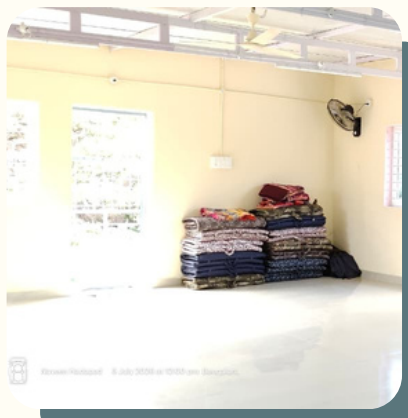
New Dormitory Inaugurated at Free Basics Girls Home

As part of our Youth Development Program, the Job Placement initiative is dedicated to empowering youth from vulnerable and economically disadvantaged backgrounds by improving their employability and connecting them with meaningful career opportunities.

The program equips young people with industry-relevant skills, career guidance, employability training, and placement support to help them successfully transition from education and training into the workforce. Through strong partnerships with corporate organizations, industries, and recruitment agencies, we bridge the gap between skilled youth and the evolving demands of the job market.

Beyond facilitating employment, our focus is on enabling sustainable livelihoods, financial independence, and long-term career growth. During the period from April to June, the program continued to support aspiring youth in building confidence, enhancing workplace readiness, and accessing opportunities that contribute to lasting socio-economic transformation.

Dileep successfully completed his 12th standard and a Nursing Assistant course, preparing him for employment. He was placed at Home Nursing Services, in the month of May with a monthly salary of ₹22,000.



Mohan

Mohan completed 1st PUC and received employability support through Need Base India. He was placed as a Supervisor at Snapbit on 1st May with a monthly salary of ₹20,000.



Jayamma

Jayamma completed her Bachelor of Arts (BA) and was supported in transitioning to formal employment. She secured a position at Toyota Auto Parts Service in January 2026 with a monthly salary of ₹18,000.



Maithra Bai

Maithra Bai completed her 10th standard and a Food & Beverage vocational course, building practical industry skills. She joined Compass Company in March 2026 with a monthly salary of ₹18,000.



Anju

Anju completed her 12th standard and a Hotel Management course, gaining the skills needed for the hospitality sector. She was placed at St. John's Hospital in April 2026 with a monthly salary of ₹18,000.



Sahith

Sahith completed his 2nd PUC Commerce, and demonstrated readiness to begin his professional career. He secured a job at Metro Sales on 1st May with a monthly salary of ₹16,000.

During the quarter (April–June), Need Base India successfully facilitated the placement of 6 youths in various organizations. The candidates secured employment with monthly starting salaries ranging from ₹16,000 to ₹22,000, enabling them to begin their professional careers with financial stability and confidence. These placements reflect the effectiveness of the program's employability training, career guidance, and industry partnerships in creating sustainable livelihood opportunities for young people from marginalized communities.
