### ALTERNATIVE CARE AND FAMILY REINTEGRATION TRAINING

On 22 January 2026, Ms. Sujatha A.T., Social Mobilizer at Bridge Camp Girls Home (BGH), attended an Alternative Care and Family Reintegration Training organized by the District Child Protection Officer (DCPO). The training enhanced participants' understanding of child-centered alternative care, including foster care, sponsorship, institutional care, and family reintegration. Sessions addressed assessing the best interests of the child, conducting home studies, providing family counselling, and ensuring effective post-reintegration follow-up. The programme also reviewed legal frameworks, documentation, coordination with Child Welfare Committees, and stakeholder roles in child protection.



### SCIENCE QUIZ COMPETITION

On 12 January 2026, children from Champion Boys Home participated in a Science Quiz Competition organized by the Agastya Foundation. Deepak and Ismail represented the home, demonstrating strong scientific knowledge, critical thinking, and teamwork. Their excellent performance secured third place, bringing pride to the home and motivating their peers. The event fostered curiosity, problem-solving, and a deeper interest in science among all participants. This achievement highlights the children's dedication to learning and their growing academic confidence.

### EYE CAMP AT JAYANAGAR RTO

The centre provides hands-on training in electrical work, plumbing, and computer hardware, equipping participants with practical skills to improve their employability. The program also offers career guidance, soft skills development, and job placement support to help youth transition into the workforce. This initiative is an important step toward creating sustainable livelihoods and helping youth from underserved communities build brighter, more independent futures.

## BUILDING YOUNG LEADERS - YUVASHAKTHI YOUTH LEADERSHIP
